





house in Tennessee before the arm of Jackson  
P. Vincent had got well and learned that  
he had fallen off a horse & broke his arm  
in a short time after he got his arm broke and  
before it - got well his father moved with him  
and balance of the family to Edmonson  
County Ky and all of them lived there and  
the Soldier continued to live in Edmonson  
County Kentucky until his death. when he  
first came to Ky. his arm had not then grown  
together and was yet in a brace. also I remember  
that some two or 3 years after he was in the arm  
he had a severe spell of fever and it settled  
or settled in his left shoulder and back greatly  
disabling his back and shoulder I then lived  
then in two and half miles of him and I  
visited while sick with the fever several times  
and he always complained of his left shoulder  
and back being weak and hurting him after  
he had said a touch of fever and he told  
me that said attack of fever had settled in his  
left shoulder and back he appeared to be  
weak in his back and left shoulder all the  
time after wards was left with the arm.

also I know that he complained of his head  
and I know that he could not hear very well  
as to Fistula I don't remember anything  
about that I heard him complain of Piles  
frequently ever since he came home from the  
army - and I judge he incurred Piles while  
in service - the spell of fever. and I believe the  
doctor (Dr Telford) said it was remittent  
fever - that occurred two or 3 years after

I remember that Jackson P Vincent was in the service in the war of the Rebellion - I remember that sometime after he came home from the army and about the year 1868 or 1869 Jackson P Vincent had a severe attack of fever and settled in his left shoulder and arm and also his back I don't remember that he had fistula he probably had it - he had piles very bad - I first heard him complain of Piles about the time he came home from the army about 1865 - his piles continued on as long as he lived I don't remember much about his hearing and I don't recollect that I heard him complain of tinnitus of his head - I lived in from 1/2 to 5 miles of him from the time we moved to Ky till the time he died with the exception of a short time I was in Illmoise and most of the time I lived in 2 or 3 miles of him after he had the attack of fever in the year 1868 or 1869 - he was very weakly and

or unable to do work or manual labor  
some of the time he could do some labor  
and some of the time he could do nothing  
and he was nearly wholly disabled for  
performing any manual <sup>work</sup> all the time from  
the time he had the attack of fever and  
from May 29<sup>th</sup> 1891 to Oct 14<sup>th</sup> 1891 he was  
not able to do any work at all and was

# IMPORTANT

## TO GUARDIANS OF PENSIONERS OF THE UNITED STATES.

Section 4766 U. S. R. S., as amended by the Act of August 8, 1882, provides: \* \* \* "But the payments to persons laboring under legal disabilities *may* be made to the guardians of such persons in the manner herein described \* \* \*."

Sections 4783 and 5486 U. S. R. S., as amended by the Act of February 10, 1891, provides: "That sections 4783 and 5486 of the Revised Statutes be, and the same are hereby, so amended as to read as follows: 'Every guardian, conservator, curator, committee, tutor, or other person having charge and custody in a fiduciary capacity of the pension of his ward, who shall embezzle the same in violation of his trust, or fraudulently convert the same to his own use, shall be punished by fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or imprisonment at hard labor for a term not exceeding five years, or both, at the discretion of the court.'"

In case of *United States v. Hall* (98 U. S. 343) the Supreme Court used the following language: "Power to protect the fund (pension) from misappropriation, fraud, and unauthorized conversion to the use of another, and to secure its safe and unimpaired transmission to the beneficiary has been claimed and exercised through the whole period since Congress under the Constitution commenced to grant such bounties. \* \* \* The United States, as the donors of the pensions, may, through the legislative department of the Government, annex such conditions to the donation as they see fit to insure its transmission unimpaired to the beneficiary. The guardian no more than the agent or attorney of the pensioner, is obliged by the laws of Congress to receive the fund; but if he does he must accept it subject to the annexed conditions. The word 'guardian' as used in the Acts of Congress, is merely the designation of the person to whom the money granted may be paid for the use and benefit of the pensioners. The fund proceeds from the United States, and inasmuch as the donation is a voluntary gift, the Congress may pass laws for its protection certainly until it passes into the hands of the beneficiary."

In order that the Commissioner of Pensions may determine whether payments of pensions to the guardians or committees of pensioners are being properly disbursed, the attached form of account will be required, correctly filled in and executed, with the voucher *next preceding the first day of January of each year*. In cases of failure to submit the account, payment on the voucher with which it is required and all subsequent payments will be withheld pending receipt of the account. In cases where the disbursements do not meet with the approval of the Commissioner of Pensions, payments will be withheld pending explanations by the guardians or committees, or pending such other action as the facts may warrant.

**The statement must not include, either in case of receipts or disbursements, any items belonging to the wards and coming to the attention of the guardians or committees from sources other than payments of pensions.**

**The accounting required herein has no bearing or relation to the requirements of the courts appointing guardians or committees as to accounting to the courts, nor to the evidence of such accounting required by pension agents when the annual payments of pensions amount to more than \$500 every two years.**

An Act to amend section forty-seven hundred and forty-six of the Revised Statutes of the United States.


Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section forty-seven hundred and forty-six of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby amended to read as follows:

"That every person who knowingly or willfully makes or aids, or assists in the making, or in any wise procures the making or presentation of any false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, voucher, or paper or writing purporting to be such, concerning any claim for pension or payment thereof, or pertaining to any other matter within the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Pensions or of the Secretary of the Interior, or who knowingly or willfully makes or causes to be made, or aids or assists in the making, or presents or causes to be presented at any pension agency any power of attorney or other paper required as a voucher in drawing a pension, which paper bears a date subsequent to that upon which it was actually signed or acknowledged by the pensioner, and every person before whom any declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing to be used in aid of the prosecution of any claim for pension or bounty land or payment thereof purports to have been executed who shall knowingly certify that the declarant, affiant, or witness named in such declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing personally appeared before him and was sworn thereto, or acknowledged the execution thereof, when, in fact, such declarant, affiant, or witness did not personally appear before him or was not sworn thereto, or did not acknowledge the execution thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for a term of not more than five years."


Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section forty-seven hundred and forty-six of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby amended to read as follows:

"That every person who knowingly or willfully makes or aids, or assists in the making, or in any wise procures the making or presentation of any false or fraudulent affidavit, declaration, certificate, voucher, or paper or writing purporting to be such, concerning any claim for pension or payment thereof, or pertaining to any other matter within the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Pensions or of the Secretary of the Interior, or who knowingly or willfully makes or causes to be made, or aids or assists in the making, or presents or causes to be presented at any pension agency any power of attorney or other paper required as a voucher in drawing a pension, which paper bears a date subsequent to that upon which it was actually signed or acknowledged by the pensioner, and every person before whom any declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing to be used in aid of the prosecution of any claim for pension or bounty land or payment thereof purports to have been executed who shall knowingly certify that the declarant, affiant, or witness named in such declaration, affidavit, voucher, or other paper or writing personally appeared before him and was sworn thereto, or acknowledged the execution thereof, when, in fact, such declarant, affiant, or witness did not personally appear before him or was not sworn thereto, or did not acknowledge the execution thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for a term of not more than five years."

# IMPORTANT

## TO GUARDIANS OF PENSIONERS OF THE UNITED STATES.

Section 4766 U. S. R. S., as amended by the Act of August 8, 1882, provides: \* \* \* "But the payments to persons laboring under legal disabilities *may* be made to the guardians of such persons in the manner herein described \* \* \*."

Sections 4783 and 5486 U. S. R. S., as amended by the Act of February 10, 1891, provides: "That sections 4783 and 5486 of the Revised Statutes be, and the same are hereby, so amended as to read as follows: 'Every guardian, conservator, curator, committee, tutor, or other person having charge and custody in a fiduciary capacity of the pension of his ward, who shall embezzle the same in violation of his trust, or fraudulently convert the same to his own use, shall be punished by fine not exceeding two thousand dollars or imprisonment at hard labor for a term not exceeding five years, or both, at the discretion of the court.'"

In case of *United States v. Hall* (98 U. S. 343) the Supreme Court used the following language: "Power to protect the fund (pension) from misappropriation, fraud, and unauthorized conversion to the use of another, and to secure its safe and unimpaired transmission to the beneficiary has been claimed and exercised through the whole period since Congress under the Constitution commenced to grant such bounties. \* \* \* The United States, as the donors of the pensions, may, through the legislative department of the Government, annex such conditions to the donation as they see fit to insure its transmission unimpaired to the beneficiary. The guardian no more than the agent or attorney of the pensioner, is obliged by the laws of Congress to receive the fund; but if he does he must accept it subject to the annexed conditions. The word 'guardian' as used in the Acts of Congress, is merely the designation of the person to whom the money granted may be paid for the use and benefit of the pensioners. The fund proceeds from the United States, and inasmuch as the donation is a voluntary gift, the Congress may pass laws for its protection certainly until it passes into the hands of the beneficiary."

In order that the Commissioner of Pensions may determine whether payments of pensions to the guardians or committees of pensioners are being properly disbursed, the attached form of account will be required, correctly filled in and executed, with the voucher next preceding the first day of January of each year. In cases of failure to submit the account, payment on the voucher with which it is required and all subsequent payments will be withheld pending receipt of the account. In cases where the disbursements do not meet with the approval of the Commissioner of Pensions, payments will be withheld pending explanations by the guardians or committees, or pending such other action as the facts may warrant.

**The statement must not include, either in case of receipts or disbursements, any items belonging to the wards and coming to the attention of the guardians or committees from sources other than payments of pensions.**

**The accounting required herein has no bearing or relation to the requirements of the courts appointing guardians or committees as to accounting to the courts, nor to the evidence of such accounting required by pension agents when the annual payments of pensions amount to more than \$500 every two years.**
