SINGLE AFFIDAVIT.

FOR GENERAL PURPOSES IN UNITED STATES CLAIM BUSINESS.

A NEW RULE.

The Departments at Washington have made a new rule, requiring, where a witness signs his or her name to an affidavit by making his or her mark (x), that two persons who can write must attest such signature by signing to the left side of the name of the affiant making a mark.
